I hope you all have a nice weekend. Please make sure that your child has passed in their **February reading log**.

I am still missing some of them. Here is what next week looks like:

Bible: We will have the test on Monday. We will be starting our new study on Miracles of Jesus. We will be learning about Jesus Heals the Paralyzed Man and The Ten Lepers.

Monthly Bible Verses: They will have a month-ending Bible verse quiz.

Math: We will be working on practice : sums to 14, addition facts to 18, subtraction facts to 18, add 3 numbers, 2 - digit addition, and math facts.

Reading: We will read with friends, listen, comprehend, read silently, and select books.

They will have a test on ***How to Hide an Octopus and Other Sea Creatures*** Monday. We will be reading ***How the Guinea Fowl Got Her Spots*** , and read each story as a class, listen to it on a CD, read it with a buddy, and practice the new vocabulary words from the story.

Vocabulary: The vocabulary words go along with the reading selection for that week. The vocabulary words are delicate, reeds, bank, admired, temper, and glossy.

Writing: The students use their morning journals twice a week. We will go over complete and incomplete sentences, author's purpose, plural nouns, synonyms and antonyms, point of view, pronouns, main idea and details, fact or opinion, compare and contrast adjectives, summarizing and organizing, prefixes (dis_, un_, mis_ and mid_) kinds of sentences, capitalization, helping and linking verbs, sequence, persuasive writing, possessive nouns and pronouns, prefixes, compound words, contractions, conjunctions, compound sentences, and following directions.

Science: We will continue working on our habitat unit.

Social Studies: We will be looking at *The World Around Us*.

Spelling: We will be working on the ow sound spelled ow and ou. For homework, they will write sentences using their spelling words. They need to use all of the spelling words (including the bonus words) and they may use up to two spelling words in a sentence. The homework will be due on **Wednesday**. The test will be on Friday.
