Sometimes it's hard to find out what your children have been doing at school. Following you will find some conversation starters to help you get them talking:

- What colors can pumpkins be?
- What tracks have you seen at outdoor school?
- What is your favorite thing about outdoor school?
- What do raccoons and bats have in common?
- What is stop-drop and roll?
- What do you dial if there is an emergency?
- Do all bats eat the same thing? What kind of bat was Stellaluna?
- What is nocturnal?
- We are sounding out and writing words now. Ask your child what sounds they hear in simple words. (cat, hen, dog, etc.)
- Rhyming is huge in Kindergarten, ask them to rhyme different words. (tree, fog, red, two, cake, etc.) Remind them that they are listening to the ending sound.

- What does it mean to love and serve God? (“Love the Lord your God and serve Him with all your heart.” Deuteronomy 11:13)
- Who is Joseph? How did God help him?
- Who helped Moses?

Yesterday one of the children noticed that the word Kindergarten begins with KIND! Today one of them realized that kind and mind rhyme, and since we are kind in Kindergarten and use our minds, we may also be called Mindergarteners!

On outdoor school days please remember tough shoes, no dress shoes, and no leggings as pants. Thank you for your help with this. Please remember you can take clothes out of the share closet anytime.

We all have so much to be thankful for this year. Our God is always faithful to His promises. I am particularly thankful that for now, we have been able to meet every day in our classroom.
