On Tuesday we had our Easter celebration. We watched a video of the Easter story. In Bible we are looking at music in our worship service. We listened to some hymns and found out this is another way we learn about Jesus and to praise Him. We will be having a unit test at the end of next week. The students will bring home a study guide to review.



In language arts the third graders read, *The Disappearing Island*. We reviewed author's purpose, irregular verbs, and word families. The third and fourth graders are finishing up their persuasive writing pieces. Next week we will begin writing a poem using personification.

During science we have been learning about electricity. We lit light bulbs and learned about parallel and series circuits. In social studies the third graders read about Samuel de Champlain. Champlain built a village he called Quebec City. The fourth graders read about "New Ideas in Human Rights." The students are learning to draw conclusions from what they read and what they already know about human rights.
